Dear Sir—From a conference the writer had with you and other prominent Buffalo citizens recently, this Association understands that your city is desirous of having a fountain such as we donate to certain cities. Such being the case, we have decided to make donation of one of these fountains to your city, delivered there free of transportation, provided the city agrees to take the fountain from the car, place it on a proper foundation, between the street car tracks near the center of Broadway, not more than 50 feet from Washington street, making good water connections and give the fountain proper continuous care.
